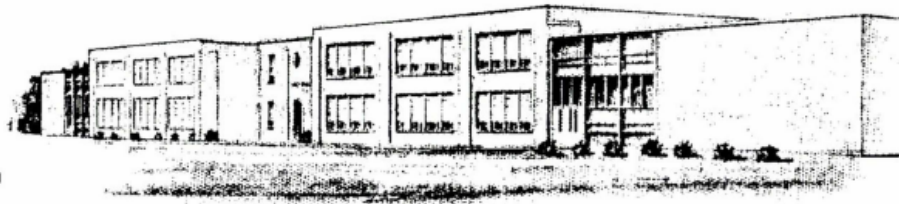

The 2005-06 year has come and gone and what a great year the students and staff of Hopewell-Loudon High School and Junior High have had. A successful year would be an understatement, but that is how I will describe the achievements of our students and staff.

Let me begin by congratulating the graduating senior class of 2006. On May 28th during a very warm afternoon ceremony, sixty-three seniors received diplomas from Hopewell-Loudon High School. Twenty-seven students graduated with honors. Andrea Engelmann, Jordan Reinhart, Melia Reinhart, Jordan Siebenaller, Janelle Kimmet, Nicole Wilcox, and Jill Kreais represented the class as the top ten percent. Once again congratulations to all of the graduates and best of luck.

During the spring our students were very active in the classroom and competing in various events representing Hopewell-Loudon. In March all students participated in statewide testing and the results are now final. I would like to commend all of our students and staff for doing so well. The results were recently received from the Ohio Department of Education for the Ohio Graduation Test and once again our tenth grade students overwhelmingly passed all five areas. In the seventh and eighth grade our students made great improvements and have passed three of the four areas of testing. I congratulate all of staff and students on this great achievement.

Throughout the winter and spring months our choir, led by Mrs. Haack, participated in various local and regional competitions. In May our concert choir competed at the state level against other choirs at Van Buren High School and fared very well. Congratulations to the choir and Mrs. Haack.

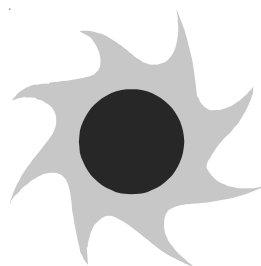

We have had another busy year with technology here at Hopewell-Loudon. We could not have achieved excellence this year without dedicated parents, students and staff. The students are taking the ball and running so fast we have a hard time catching up. Some of the elementary students had done strong research on the internet for their science projects and a special thanks to Morgan Schalk for her plastic making project. I used some of it to caulk cracked computer cases (good stuff).

There are some student concerns about not having Microsoft PowerPoint, Excel and Word at home. I have a download on my webpage called Open Office which is a free office productivity package compatible with Microsoft Office. There is a setup guide on my website as well. Look for the technology link at our school webpage: <http://www.hopewell-loudon.org>. If you have dialup you will need to bring by a blank CD-R and I will put open office on the CD for you. If you want to buy Microsoft Office we do have a good rate through <http://www.journeyed.com/edResources/>. Here are a few examples of their prices: Microsoft Office Pro, \$89.98 - Windows XP Pro Upgrade, \$89.98. There will be flyers at the Office during the summer and I have a link called Journey Ed on my website.

In the fall you will be seeing a lot of information about internet safety (isafe). We will have information broadcast on Bascom Cable Channel 14, posted to the webpage, and a community training session. This program is designed to inform students to be aware while on the internet as well as an educational tool for parents to be more observant of what their child is doing on the internet. 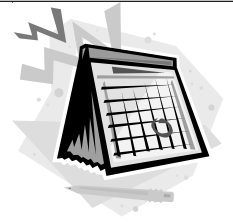

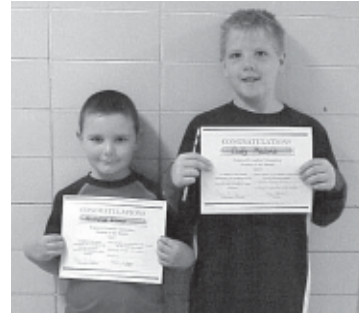
